
Average Monthly Job Change By Administration

Trump/Republican Budget At A Glance


- \$7 trillion in deficit-financed tax handouts for corporations and billionaires.
 - \$5.5 trillion that Republicans fraudulently claim are free
 - \$1.5 trillion in additional revenue losses
- \$880 billion in cuts that will decimate Medicaid
- \$230 billion in cuts that threaten food assistance
- \$5 trillion debt limit increase
- More than **\$14** trillion in new debt over the decade

Trump/Republican Budget At A Glance

In Virginia's Third Congressional District (VA-03) Alone:

- 25,000 people who receive coverage under the Affordable Care Act in VA-03 would see their average premium go up by \$810 per year a 66% increase.
- In VA-03, the 253,052 people on Medicaid (also known in Virginia as Cardinal Care) are at risk of losing their health care under Republican budget plans.
- Threatens the 122,000 people in VA-03 who count on SNAP to put food on the table.
- Would jeopardize the futures of 23,145 students in VA-03 who use Pell grants to help afford their education.
- Across Virginia, the Republican budget threatens 451,117 children who rely on free school lunches.

Trump/Republican Budget Extends Tax Cuts for the Wealthy and Harms the Middle Class



House Budget Shifts More Income Toward Wealthy, Cuts Health Care, Food, Help for College \$1.4 trillion in cuts affecting low- and \$1.8T in tax cuts would go to people with middle-income people. 

Trump's Tariffs and Trade Wars

- Tariffs increase the prices of imported goods, including products that the United States does not, nor cannot, produce in large quantities, such as coffee.
- Trump's tariffs and trade wars amount to a massive tax on American consumers.
- The Center for American Progress estimates Trump's tariffs could cost American households an average of \$5,200 every year.

Elon Musk's Illegal Mass Firings

- The Trump Administration has unleashed chaos and confusion with Executive Orders and Elon Musk's so-called Department of Government Efficiency, or DOGE.

- Countless lawsuits have been filed, and they are moving through the courts.

Leading Committee Democrats in Pushing Back on the Trump – Musk Chaos

Resolutions of Inquiry: Following the Trump Administration's illegal Executive Order to dismantle the Education Department (ED), I introduced a to demand transparency and information from the President and Secretary of Education regarding the Administration's efforts to dismantle ED and its potential impact on students nationwide.

GAO Reports: The government watchdog is conducting a report, at my request, to assess the security of information technology systems at the Department of Education (ED), the Department of Labor (DOL), and the Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) following reports of President Trump and Elon Musk's unsanctioned Department of Government Efficiency's (DOGE) illegally accessing data from various government agencies.

Amicus Briefs: House and Senate Democratic Leadership filed an amicus brief opposing President Donald Trump's unlawful attempts to fire National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) Member Gwynne Wilcox.

Civil Rights Forum: I hosted a forum with civil rights leaders to discuss how they are fighting the Trump Administration's systematic attacks on students, workers, and families.

PROTECTING THE RIGHT TO ORGANIZE ACT

- The Protecting the Right to Organize (PRO) Act (H.R. 20) ensures that workers can decide for themselves whether to exercise their right to form a union.
- •This legislation would be the most significant upgrade for workers' collective bargaining rights in more than 80 years.
- •The PRO Act: (1) empowers workers to exercise their right to organize;
- (2) holds employers accountable for violating workers' rights; and (3) secures free, fair, and safe union elections.

RAISE the WAGE

GOOD FOR WORKERS, GOOD FOR BUSINESS, GOOD FOR THE ECONOMY

- Gradually raise the federal minimum wage from \$7.25 to \$17 by 2030.
- Index future increases in the federal minimum wage to median wage growth to ensure the value of minimum wage does not once again erode over time.
- Guarantee tipped workers are paid at least the full federal minimum wage by phasing out the subminimum wage for tipped workers, which will ensure decent, consistent pay without eliminating tips.
- Guarantee teen workers are paid at least the full federal minimum wage by phasing out the rarely used subminimum wage for youth workers.
